From 1911 to 1996, the Indianapolis 500 was the only race in the world to be held on a dirt track. The race was held at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, which was built in 1909. The race was named after the number of laps, 500, and the word "Indian" was added to honor the Native American people who lived in the area. The race was first held in 1911 and has since become one of the most popular and profitable races in the world.
